June 15, 2016 Draft Meeting Minutes:

Executive Meeting: The Vice President, Al Liebetrau, called the meeting to order at 6:00 p.m. In attendance: Marty Betsch, Karen Cameron, Al Liebetrau, Suzie Meeker, Elizabeth Prindle, Deb Simon, Del Walker, Clara Walker, and Jules Wetzel.

The May secretary's report was in the CORC Connections newsletter. The club is developing letterhead which can be used to thank program speakers. Marty Betsch, Treasurer, reported that there is \$1800.38 in the treasury. Marty will remove people from the mailing list who have not paid their dues for the current year.

The dates of the upcoming shows at Prineville, Madras, Sisters and the NFMS/AFMS show in Albany were discussed. The club members are encouraged to attend the shows which replace the June field trip. Al will not be able to do the fluorescent display at the Prineville show due to lack of time for preparation. The Prineville field trips are planned for Friday Richardson's Rock Ranch, Saturday the Lucky Strike mine, and Sunday McDonald's Ranch or Friend's Ranch. Clara and Del Walker have prepared a club display for the Prineville show and will have club flyers on hand.

The July field trip is scheduled for July 17, and the location is tentatively set at the Warm Springs Indian reservation to collect Sunflower Flats jasper. A Plan B is being developed in case it is not possible to get permission to go to the Indian Reservation.

The club picnic is July 24 at Tom and Debbie Klug's home in Redmond, and more details will be included in the next club newsletter. There will be a brief business meeting at the picnic.
