# Minutes for the CORC Meeting July 18, 2018

The meeting was called to order at 7:05 p.m. Elizabeth Prindle, club President, welcomed members and guests. Everyone was reminded to sign in for door prizes and attendance. Approximately 30 members and guests were present.

**Program** – Don Ross discussed rock painting and brought samples of rocks that can be left in public places for others to find. He recommended first clean the rocks well and use acrylic paint matte finish for the best results. He suggested spraying the rock with outdoor clear acrylic spray to seal the paint. Glow in the dark paint can be used for fun. Don offered to help anyone interested in getting started with this hobby by calling him at 541-604-5741. Don also showed an interesting PowerPoint presentation about Crater Rock Museum in Central Point, OR in the Medford area. **Treasurer Report –** Marty Betsch, club Treasurer, announced the ending balance. The club receives money by the annual club dues and the silent auction held at the summer club picnic. Members contribute rocks and other associated items such as rock-related books and magazines for the club to sell at the silent auction. Expenditures include the purchase of liability insurance, a new computer, room rental, postage costs to mail monthly newsletter to members without email, and food and beverages for the summer picnic and holiday party.

**NO REGULAR MEETING IN AUGUST** - The Club Picnic on Sunday, August 12, will replace the regular meeting for the month of August. The picnic will be held at 1 p.m. at the home of Ken and Roxanne Lawson in Redmond. Their address is 3061 SW Meadow Ln, Redmond. The club provides hamburgers and hot dogs, paper goods and some beverages, and everyone is asked to bring either a side dish or a dessert. If possible, please also bring a lawn chair. If you have a shade canopy, please come early to help set up.

The picnic provides the opportunity for members to sell their own rock-related items, including jewelry, equipment, and, of course, rocks. If you plan to sell, please bring your own folding table. As mentioned already, the club picnic has a silent auction where members donate rocks and related items to the club. This is the only fundraiser of the year, so please help out.
